Virtual Hindi Diwas was celebrated on 14 September, 2020.














Reading week - Grade 1 and 2

From story blocks, character mapping, drawing pictures, poster making and many more, these activities were art integrated and brought out the students' creativity to the forefront.






Reading Week - Grades 3,4,5


White and Whisper
