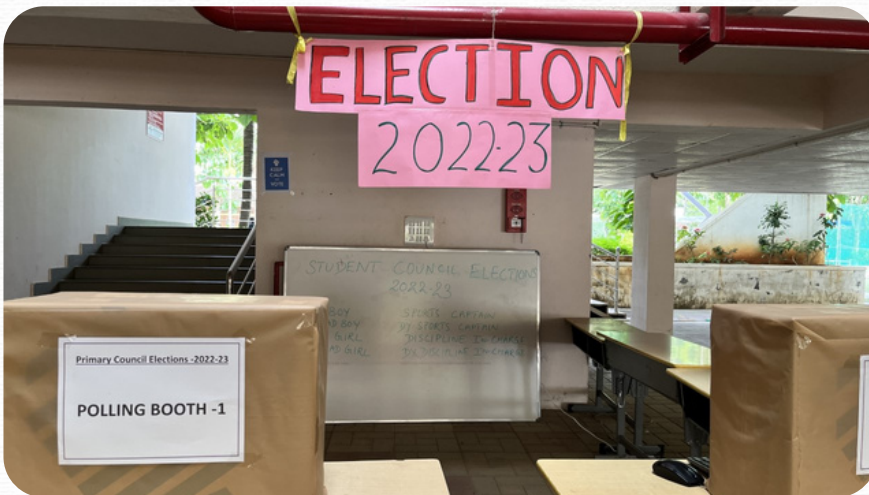
The event also witnessed felicitation of School toppers, proficiency winners, state level and national level winners in various fields.

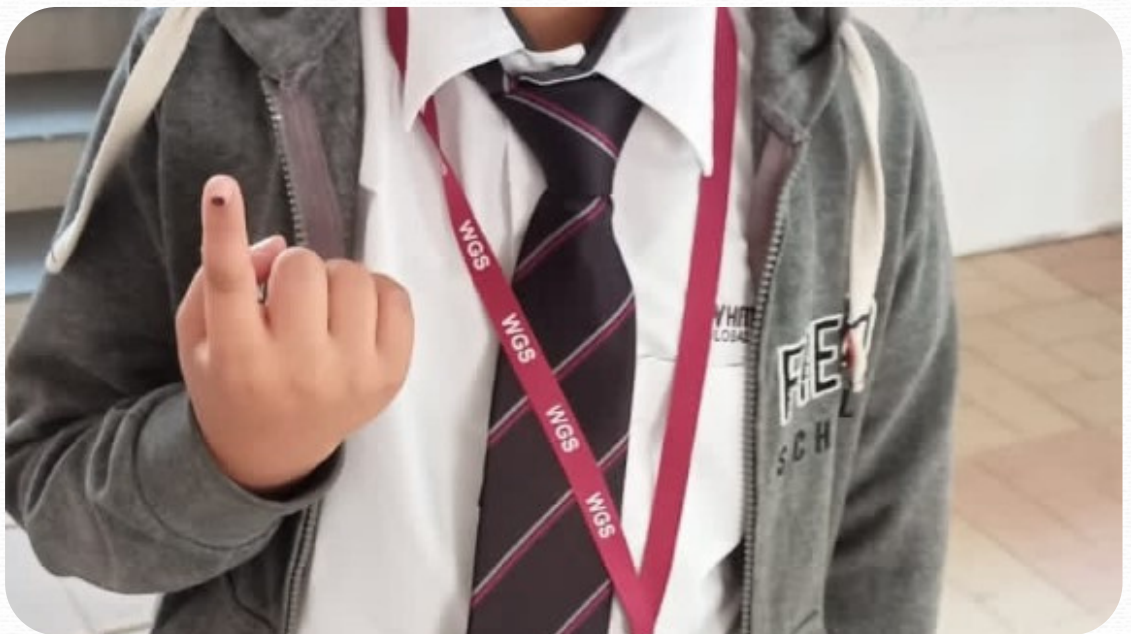


PRIMARY STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTION

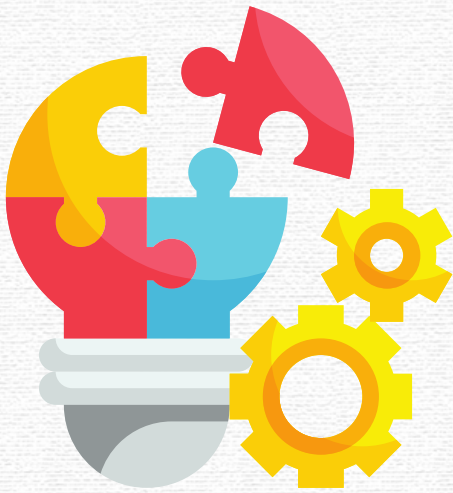




SUBJECT ACTIVITIES – GRADES I AND II

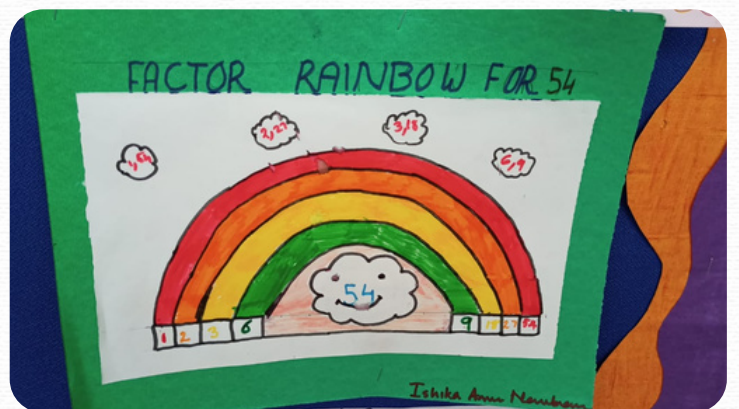
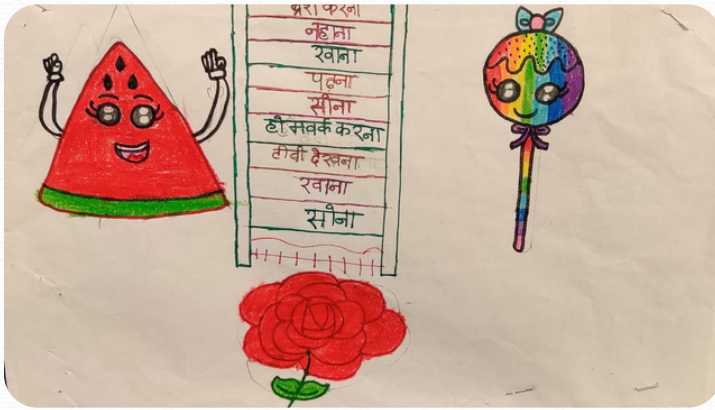
SUBJECT ACTIVITIES – GRADES III TO V

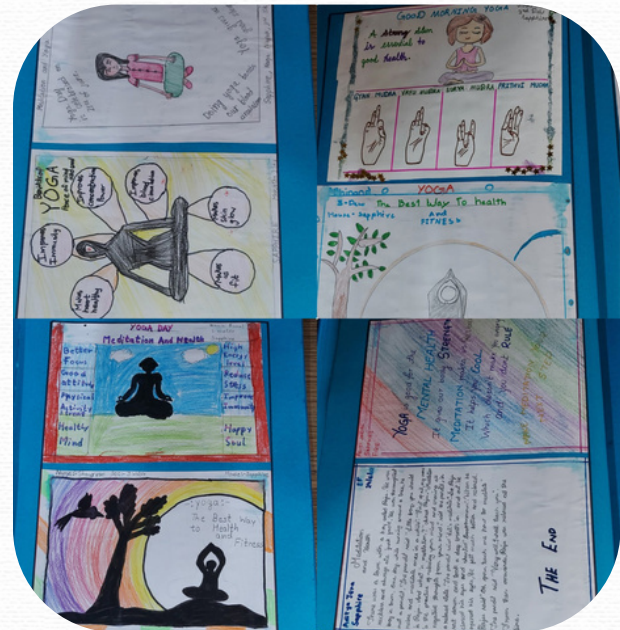

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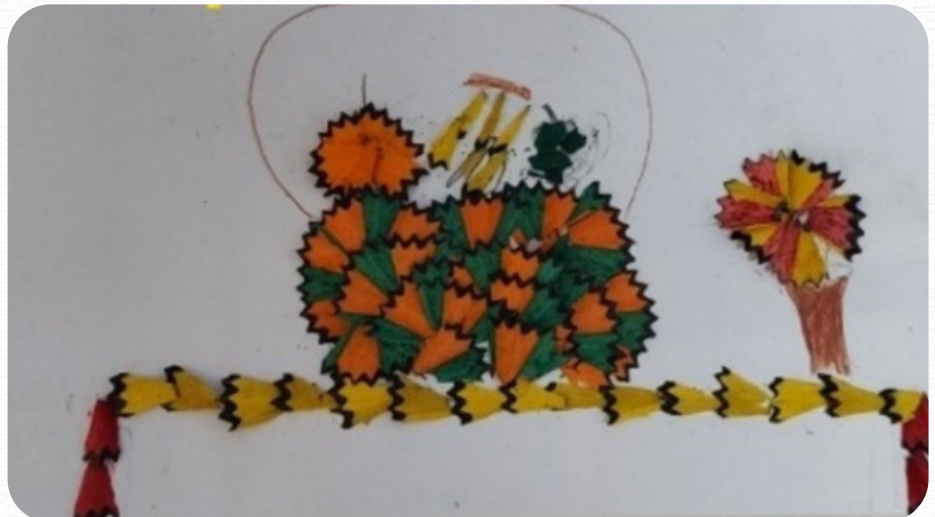
CCA – PENCIL SHAVE ART – GRADES III TO V

WORK EXPERIENCE CLUBS

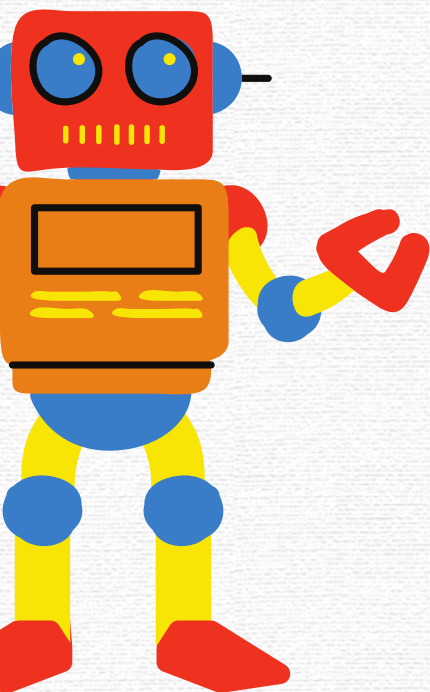

YOUNG POETESS

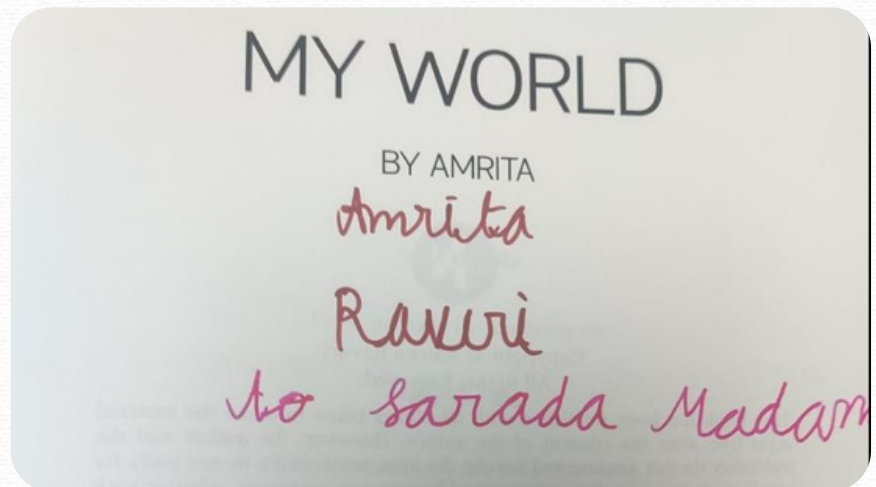
The world of literature is vast. There is never a day you will know it all, but rather grow each day by exploring the ocean of knowledge with patience and skills.

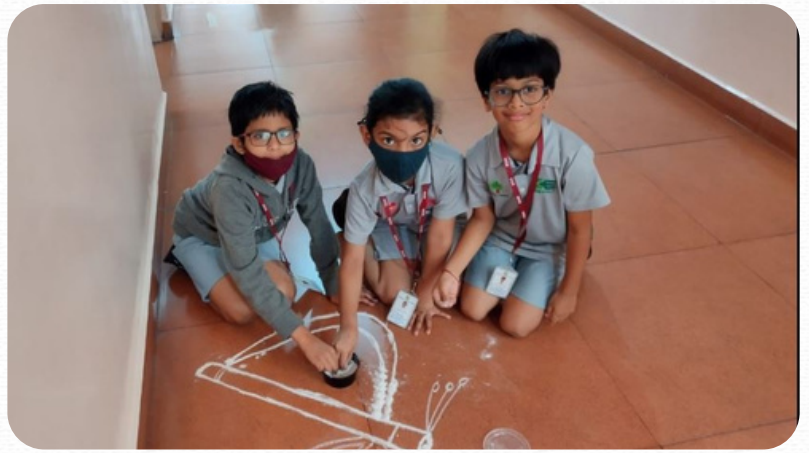
JANMASHTAMI CELEBRATION

CCA – RUBIK’S CUBE GRADES III TO V

If you are curious, you'll find the puzzles around you. If you are determined, you will solve them.

The cube is, at the same time, a symbol of simplicity and complexity. Speed cubing (or speed solving) is the practice of trying to solve a Rubik's Cube in the shortest time possible. Solving Rubik's cube requires memorizing many algorithms while twisting and turning the layers in under a few seconds.

CCA Event 4, Rubik's Cube Challenge was held on September 2, 2022. The students of grades 3, 4 and 5 participated in the speed cubing competition with great zest and fervor.

The clatter of Rubik's Cubes twisting in unison filled the room. It took a mixture of skill and determination for students to solve the cube on their own. The entire competition was fun, which unlocked the potential of speed cubers and the students' significant concentration, mind-body coordination, sharpness, and quick reflexes enhanced their problem-solving skills and boosted their confidence.





PBL FIELD TRIP – GRADES IV AND V

Crucial to science education is hands-on involvement: showing, not just telling; real experiments and field trips, not just "virtual reality".

Research in education has shown that we remember field trips long into adulthood.

Students in grades 4 and 5 were taken to the meteorological department on the 18th and 19th of August 2022 to show them the instruments that are used to forecast the weather and also their usage. The field trip provided students with a platform to experience SDG-goal 13—Climate Action. The students were able to connect their learning through this field trip. The students were able to see the workings of the various tools and instruments that they learned about in the classroom through model making, picture activities, and videos. The explanation provided by the organisers was very beneficial for the students

In aggregate, 410 students and 20 teachers visited the meteorological department. The staff of MET were awestruck at the knowledge of the students and the queries that were raised to them. Teachers and students had a great learning experience. Overall, it was a fun, memorable, and effective learning trip for everyone.



PBL ACTIVITIES – GRADES IV AND V

Project based learning is an integral part of learning at Whitefield Global School. Each year students take up a Sustainable Development Goal and engage in activities and complete a project to learn more about the goal and resolution to the challenges faced.

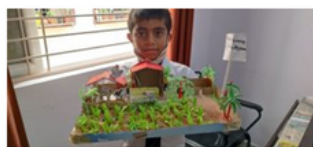
At Whitefield Global School students of Grade 4 and 5 were empowered to learn about SDG # 13- 'Climate Action' during their Project Based Learning (PBL). The PBL commenced on 16th August 2022 and culminated with a presentation of the learning during the 10 day-period on 29th August 2022.

During the PBL, children enhanced their learning process through various activities and projects in all the subjects in an integrated mode aimed at making students think more about SDG #13.

The students created earth quake models, model on afforestation and deforestation, anemometer, biome, bar graph, line graph, model on prefix and suffix, letter writing, naara lekhan (slogan writing) and google slides presentation.

The event culminated with a final presentation by Students on all their learnings and awareness about the importance of Climate Action.

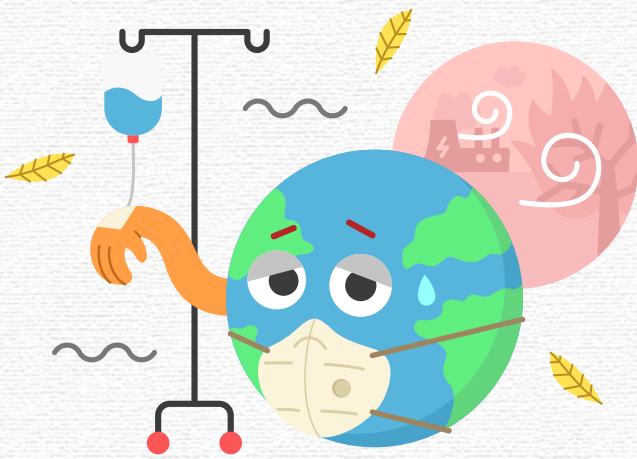

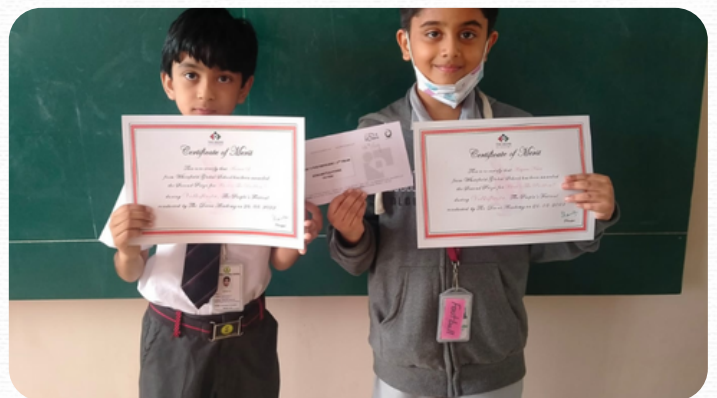
WGS is proud of Adwait Abhilash of grade V for receiving All India Rank 4 in junior level dance category of the Tao National School League online competition.
