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
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Principal's Address



The day concluded with a proud moment as our esteemed Principal Ma'am honored the winners with medals, marking an unforgettable celebration of dedication and teamwork!








Makara Sankranti Celebrations

World Scholars Cup


On the 18th and 19th of January, our school sent eight of its best teams to the prestigious World Scholars Cup event held at Greenwood High International School, Sarjapur. Upon arrival, we received our competition ID cards and headed straight for the auditorium, which was massive and accommodate 600 people in a single sitting. Soon, they played various songs to refresh our mood after the hour-long travel. The organizers then proceeded with the opening ceremony where they briefed us about the competition. Our first major event was the Team Debate, where two teams debated across various motions. After the debates, we went to the cafeteria for lunch. Shortly after, they asked us to sit in a large hall where they introduced two other events: the Collabowrite and the Scholars Challenge.





In Collabowrite, we were given six prompts and needed to write essays, diary entries, stories, or even poems. The best part about Collabowrite was that we could sit as a team and discuss amongst ourselves. After Collabowrite, we were asked to sit away from our teammates for the next event, the Scholars Challenge. 


Republic Day



Through the Student Lens: Insights, Inspiration, and Innovation

THE SCIENCE & THEORIES OF TIME TRAVEL

1. CONCEPT OF TIME TRAVEL:

Time travel is the movement from one point in time to another, usually by a "time machine." There are mainly two types of time travel—forward time travel, which involves moving into the future, and backward time travel, which means going back into the past.

2. THEORIES OF TIME TRAVEL:

Einstein's Theory of Relativity and Time Dilation:

Time is relative and changes with speed and gravity. This revolves around Einstein's concept of time dilation, which basically means the slowing down of time. For example, if you are sitting next to your crush and talking to him or her for two hours, it feels as if only two minutes have passed. But if you sit on a hot frying pan for even two seconds, it feels as if it has been two hours since you sat on the pan. Before Einstein, time was considered constant. Yet, with his theory, time can actually change with speed and gravity. Considering speed, if the speed is greater, time would pass slower. Time is relative, and it slows down in relation to us.

So, theoretically speaking, if we build a spaceship that can travel at the speed of light, you can travel to the future. You first travel in space for a couple of years, and when you come back, a long time would have passed on Earth. If you travel in space for ten years, then 9,000 years would have passed on Earth!

These are a few scientific concepts that help in the Time Travel Theory:

- **General Relativity:** Allows time travel, such as by means of wormholes, which are hypothetical passages through space-time, and time dilation.
- **Quantum Mechanics:** Certain interpretations (e.g., many-worlds theory) do permit time travel in a quantum setting.

3. MAJOR OBSTACLES:

Establishing or maintaining stable wormholes:

This generally avoids paradoxes like the "grandfather paradox," where a means to travel back in time would create logical contradictions by changing past events.

4. PRACTICAL ISSUES:

- **Energy Requirements:** The amount of energy needed for time travel is immense, especially for making and keeping a stable wormhole.
- **Speed of Light Limitation:** Time travel is also possible if we travel at the speed of light (3 × 10⁸ m/s) or faster. BUT this is practically not possible. First of all, making a spaceship that can travel at the speed of light is currently not possible, as any spaceship would be destroyed if it tried to travel at such a speed. Let's say that we made such a spaceship, but when a person is traveling in it at such a high speed, his body wouldn't survive. Even his other organs would be damaged, and he would die, making it pointless for him to travel in that spaceship.
- Causality Problems: Traveling back in time would violate the principle of causality and possibly bring about paradoxes and interference in the flow of time, like the famous Grandfather Paradox. Let's say we traveled back in time and killed our grandfather when he was young. This would mean that he would have never married, so he wouldn't have had a son or any grandchildren. So, how were you born?

5. CONCLUSION:


To conclude, time travel is still purely theoretical, with no experimental evidence that it is feasible. On paper, it seems that time travel is possible, as many theories suggest it, but with so many practical issues, it feels impossible.

Physics is still exploring this field, and future research may ultimately determine whether time travel is possible.
