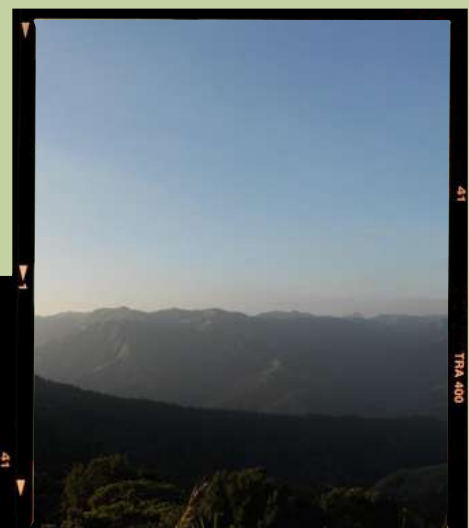
EXCURSION – 9TH & 11TH

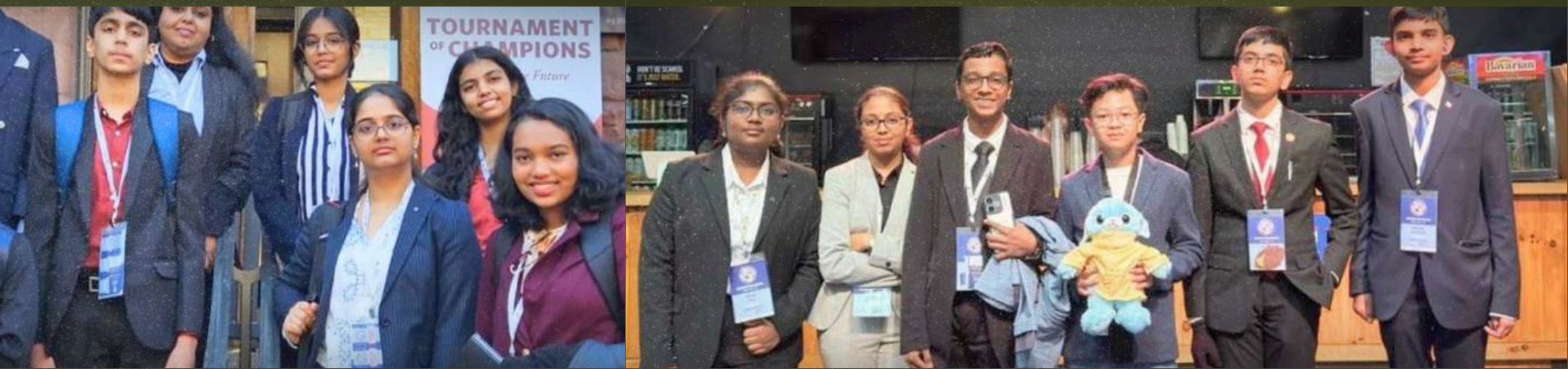

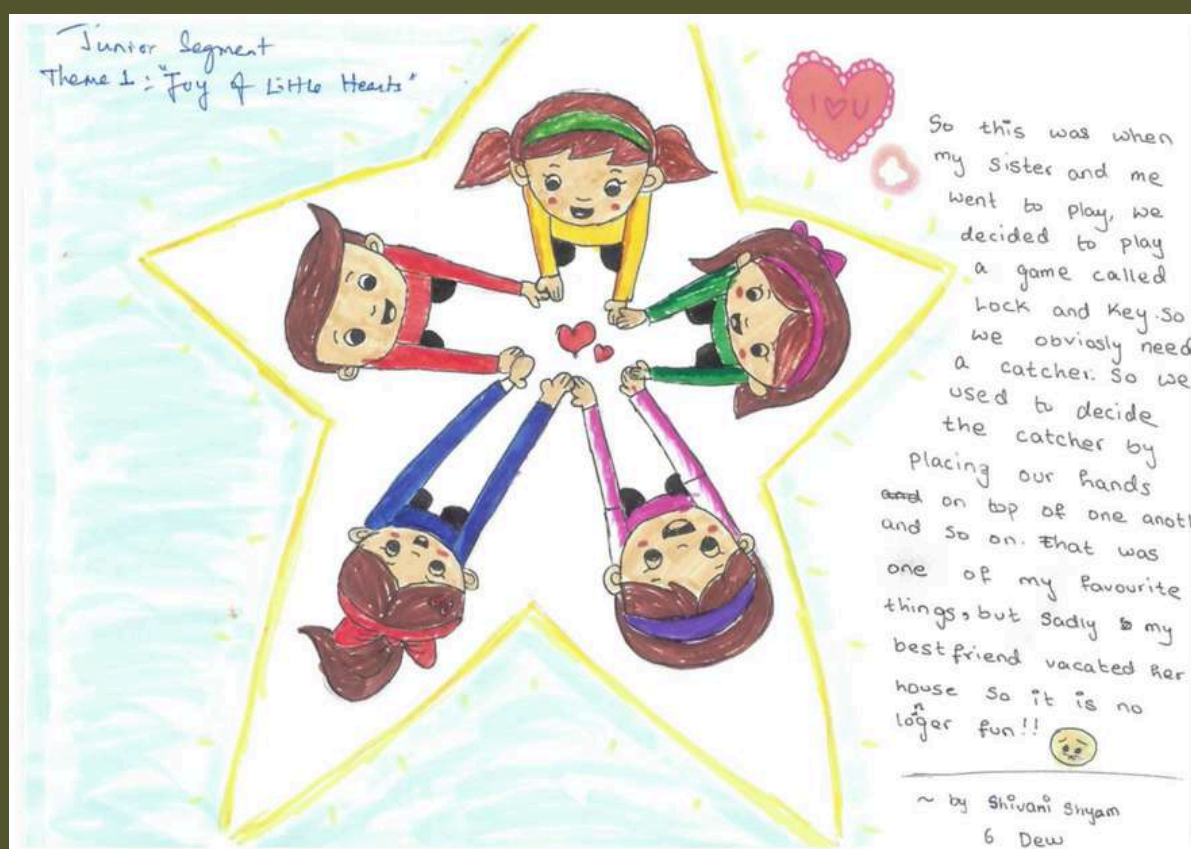
